

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today is the first day of Spring. After a very cold weekend it was lessage in the 50's today. It does not seem like spring is here but it is.

The full moon happened this month on March 7th and the next full moon is April 6th and it is called the Pink Moon.

Easter is usually associated with Spring. It is the first real holiday/celebration of Spring. Even the occurrence of Easter comes with Spring. Easter Sunday is the first Sunday that falls after the first full moon that comes after vernal equinox. Therefore, Easter is the 9th of April this year. This formula was arrived at over 1600 years ago in the Council of Nicaea (Nicaean Creed) that wanted to set a Christian date for the celebration of the Christian feast of Easter. The Orthodox church uses a different calculation. Orthodox Easter is celebrated on the Sunday after the first full moon after Passover. Next year Ash Wednesday is February 14th and Easter is March 31st.

Occasionally we see articles that try and say that Easter is really based on a pagan festival, and that we should not celebrate it. This is similar to what is said at Halloween and Christmas. Fortunately, most of these folks are just wrong, and have not looked up the history of any of these celebrations.

Now before I get too involved in this, I will be the first to say that some of the ways we celebrate these holidays do come to us from Pagan festivals, but not the feasts themselves. Think of the yule log at Christmas, some of the costumes at Halloween, and the Easter egg.

Surprisingly the egg has been a symbol of rebirth for a long time, even dating back to the Egyptians. However early Mesopotamian Christians colored eggs red for Easter to remind them of the blood Jesus shed on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter. So not totally a pagan custom. Take a look at the Ukrainian Easter Eggs the Ukrainian Orthodox usually make. Orthodox Easter this year is April 16th a full week later.



How do you celebrate Easter? We all have our customs born out of families and how they did holidays and such. But the biggest part of any of this is celebrating.

Easter starts the beginning of the end of our festival cycle in the church year. Our Church year began with Advent, then Christmas, Epiphany, Lent and now Easter. It ends with Pentecost. Then we begin what is called the long green season of Sunday's after Pentecost.

Even though we don't have any festivals to celebrate during the long green season, there is always something to celebrate. Sometimes I don't think we take the time to just celebrate. Celebrate living, celebrate life, celebrate church.

What do you have to celebrate? Let us know so we can celebrate with you. Take the time to celebrate what God has done for you.

Everyone loves a celebration, so come on and celebrate, give thanks for such a wonderful powerful, and loving God.



Help for Our Lutheran Friends in Madagascar



Historic Flooding & Inflation Impacting Staff and Students

In 2014, ministry partners of the Mid-South District were introduced to Rev. Joseph Randrianasolo and the Lutheran Institute of Management & Entrepreneurship (LIME) in Madagascar. Since then, friends in the Mid-South District have faithfully supported this Lutheran ministry through technology upgrades, significant facility improvements, and other enhancements that have helped LIME serve its students and provide them with opportunities for a brighter future.

Along with many positive milestones, the ministry has endured a number of crises over the last decade, from the impacts of the pandemic to those of severe drought. Through each challenge, ministry partners in the Mid-South District have prayerfully supported the staff, students and mission of LIME. Today, our Malagasy Lutheran brothers and sisters need help once again as both flooding and inflation threaten not only the future of LIME, but the daily lives of its staff and their families.

As Rev. Joseph Randrianasolo recently shared in an urgent communication with Mid-South District President, Rev. Dr. Roger Paavola, the current situation for LIME is very serious. Madagascar's isolated geography requires the import of many essential goods and resources, all of which have risen in cost dramatically with global inflation. Flooding has also devastated supplies of domestic resources, making staples like rice and other foods more scarce and expensive. These factors have not only reduced enrollment at LIME, but made daily life so expensive for the staff that they struggle to feed themselves and their families.

As our friends in Madagascar pray for recovery from the floods and an easing of inflation, they also pray and humbly ask for help from their Mid-South District Lutheran family. Please prayerfully consider sharing a financial gift to help sustain the LIME ministry—and especially its staff—through this current crisis.


