It seems last month we were talking about the new year, and now we are talking about Lent.

Pastor's Message Easter falls early this year and therefore Ash Wednesday falls even earlier. This year a unique thing will take place. Ash Wednesday will fall on Valentine's Day. This has not happened since 1945 (79 years ago.)

Why is this uniqueness so interesting? The beginning of a season of penitence and self-reflection falling on a day that signifies love.

The intersection here, is that Lent precedes Easter which concludes a week that shows us the ultimate act of love.

Look at it this way. Lent starts off with Ash Wednesday where we put crosses on the forehead made out of the ashes of the palm branches used in the previous year's Palm Sunday celebration. (we take a short cut here in buying pre made ashes.) Palm Sunday begins Holy Week in which our Lord prepared for his betrayal by riding into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey, celebrated his last supper with his disciples and then was betrayed by one of his disciples and then put on trial sentenced to death and then hung on a cross on what we call Good Friday. He was then buried in the tomb. (Sounds like the creed doesn't it.)

On the third day he rose and declared victory over death. The ultimate act of love.

God showed his love for us by allowing His son to become a sacrifice for us on the cross.

Love is the overriding theme of Ash Wednesday, Lent, Holy Week and Easter. God's love for us.

So it is fitting that Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's day a day that celebrates love, as we begin a season that celebrates love, as the ultimate act of love was Christ's death on the cross.

This year for Lent we will be looking at the Fruits of the Spirit.

Please join us at 6:30 PM each Wednesday starting on Valentine's Day February 14th.

Hopefully the weather in February will be a little better that we have had in January.

Oh as a side note. If you want to take your special other out for a Valentines dinner, do it on February 13th. You will miss the crowds.
