Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

March brings us Saint Patrick's Day. Everyone wears green and claims Irish heritage.

But I think the celebrations often miss the point. Saint Patrick along with many other early church Bishops and priests did a lot of missionary work.

Patrick was an English born man who lived during the time of Roman rule of Britain. Patrick's main work was the evangelization of the Irish people. He baptized thousands and ordained priests and generally provided for Christian work and teaching in Ireland, during the 5<sup>th</sup> century.

Patrick along with many other early Christian leaders did a lot of missionary work among people who did not know Christ.

Another early Christian leader that did this was Boniface. Boniface came later and died a martyr in Germany during the 8<sup>th</sup> century.

I know about Boniface as he is the patron Saint of Fulda, Germany my mother's hometown and his grave is at the Cathedral in her hometown of Fulda.

Boniface was again English born but saw his job to Christianize the Franks and the Frisians (Frisia is the far north end of Germany, along the North Sea.) He established Diocese that the Catholic Church still uses in Germany today.

Why did I mention these two individuals? I am sure in their day they did not consider themselves adventurous, or special, but the work they did laid foundations for many who came after them to establish and keep the church going.

We often forget the work that was done to establish our own church in Pine Bluff, or the church body here in America. Ordinary people doing the work that Christ called them to do. No one was trying to establish themselves for posterity, or worry about what their legacy would look like. They were doing the work of the Lord.

I think we often get hung up on how everyone is going to look at me, or what do people think of me. That is not why God created us, or why he has called us to where we are. God has called us to serve His kingdom. Sometimes that work is dirty and boring and not really fulfilling. Other times it feels exciting and purposeful. Either way it is still the Lord's work that needs to be done.

God's work needs to be done in many places and people get called to do it all the time. Sometimes it is us, and sometimes it is someone else. But either way God needs us all to make his kingdom work here on earth. There will probably not be a day to celebrate us in the future, but that is OK. We are doing what needs to be done here today.

Have a happy Saint Patty's Day and remember the work that he accomplished. There are still kingdoms that need to be witnessed to, and we pray God finds someone to do it.


Julie Shorts was hostess. Pat Baughman informed the group about a book of Bible verses and the many situations in which the Scripture verses would be helpful.
