### **MARY GUILD**

Mary Guild met on July 11, 2024 with twelve members present. Arleen Parsley gave the opening devotion, "Our Dwelling Place, reminding us of the external being of God. He is our refuge and dwelling place. The topic was presented by invited guests who were resource women from JRMC. One speaker talked about the importance of an annual physical checkup; one speaker advised women to have a yearly mammogram; another detailed the work of the Dunklin Jones Cancer Center. There was also a presentation giving information about the new Donna Terrel lodge that is to be built soon. It will be dedicated to responding to the spiritual and emotional needs of women receiving cancer treatment.

The Mary Guild mission project for July was a gathering of school supplies for the Black Fire Fighters Association (B.R.A.V.E.). The mission project for August is a monetary donation for Lutherans for Life. Pat Baughman will open the August meeting with a devotion; Cherrie Bradley will give a topic and the hostess is Karen Witt.

On June 7-9, 2024 Pat Baughman was the delegate for Mary Guild at the LWML District Convention. The following is her personal account of the convention experience: The District Convention in Memphis June 7-9 was wonderful event. One hundred and sixty four women and pastors from the Mid-South District were there including Karen Witt and Pat Baughman. Lots of business to take care of, plenty of fun and fellowship and many interesting quest speakers. The humorous interrupter. Wendy Sue Fluegge, kept us entertained as Tabitha Katt and asked that we call her Tabby. She also entertained us at the banquet with her humor and her beautiful singing. In our election of officers, one of our own, Erin Foster, was chosen as South-Arkansas Financial Secretary. There were



several offerings collected: \$2127 for the Mid South Mission Goal; \$1794 for Transitions of Dyer County, Dyersburg, TN-a residential program for women;\$1979 for Dream Center of Jackson, TN-a faith-based educational ministry for women and children who have experienced crisis and/or loss in their lives. Gifts of the Heart, an ingathering of baby items and monies, was collected.

Speakers were Kaye Wolff, speaking on different Ministries, Linda Gage on gift planning, and Missionary Speakers, Ed Mell on Guatemala, and Cindy Jurgensen on Tanzania.

There were 16 out of 25 Mission Grants voted in for the next biennium. The two with the most votes were Isaiah 117 House and Compassion Closet Ministry Funds, both of which support children in Foster Care. Several other grants were in support of Seminary students, some were for homeless families, worship transportation for the wheelchair bound, food pantries, and camperships for Camp Petit Jean and many more.




