

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year Lent begins in March. Ash Wednesday is March 5, the first Wednesday of March.

**Pastor's Message** *for* **Lent** Many years ago, I read an article by Rev Dr. David Lose, a Lutheran Pastor in Minnesota (ELCA). The article always stuck with me. I am sharing a portion of that article below.

"Lent.

Among many Christian congregations it's become something of a dirty, four-letter word. To start, many churches no longer observe this age-old (fourth century!) tradition - it's too old-fashion, too "Roman," too medieval for many denominations in America to handle.

And even among those traditions which do honor the season, rarely is there the same kind of enthusiasm or expectancy which greets a season like Advent. After all, there are no presents at the end, no fun and games along the way. And giving up things, please! We've had to sacrifice enough already because of the economy, thank you very much; why should we give up anything more for God?

Penitence. Sacrifice. Contemplation. These are the words of Lent. I have a hard time believing they were popular even in the days of the Puritans - you know, when folks actually held competitions to see who could resist the greatest temptation or avoid the most pleasure - let alone now, when delayed gratification is viewed with suspicion and everyone from politicians to advertisers promises that we really can have it all."

Now really no one looks forward to Lent like we do with Advent. Advent, we know brings Christmas and it is only four weeks long.

Now Lent brings forth Easter, but it is 7 weeks long and its emphasis, like he wrote, is Penitence, Sacrifice and Contemplation. Not fun topics. Twenty plus years ago Mel Gibson's movie, The Passion of Christ was released, and everyone went gaga over it. You see every year during the Lenten season we relive the Passion of Christ, especially Good Friday.

But the issue is, Lent is an important part of our Liturgical Season. To understand Easter, we must have Christmas and Lent. We do not understand the importance of Christ 's sacrifice and his resurrection otherwise.

As we begin that long slow journey we call Lent, let us remember why we do it.

I further quote Rev. Lose,

"Yes. I need Lent. I need an absence of gifts so that I might acknowledge the Gift. I need a time to be quiet and still, a time to crane my neck and lift my head, straining to hear again what was promised me at Baptism: "You are mine! I love you! I am with you...always!"

I need Lent to remind me of who I am - God's heir and Christ's co-heir - so that, come Easter, I can rejoice and celebrate with all the joy, all the revelry, all the anticipation, of a true heir to the throne. Thanks be to God!"


### Hearts for Jesus: Help 4 Haiti

Haiti's children face a lot of uncertainty. Over the past decade, the nation of Haiti has suffered four hurricanes, two major earthquakes and two catastrophic floods. They live in poverty (58%) and the families earn \$3.65 per day <u>or less.</u> Many have limited access to necessities like good food and water, adequate housing and medical care. Because of this about 25% of Haitian children do not live with their birth parents (often living instead on the streets or in orphanages). Violent gangs have arisen across the country making it dangerous for children to attend school and church.

In the midst of so much uncertainty, Haiti's children need to hear that Jesus, their Savior loves them and wilt never leave them. Our "Hearts for Jesus' this year with go to helping short-term mission teams travel to Haiti to share the gift of Jesus Christ as they provide medical care, build homes and minister to the hurting Haitian people. The Lutheran Heritage Foundation will share books of God's love in a lasting way. When you give a Haitian child a book about Jesus, written in a language they can read and understand, you're sharing the Good News, even if the child can't go to school or Sunday School.

"Hearts for Jesus" is an offering given every February, the month of Love so you each can be a part. The Sunday school children and Adult Bible Class offerings will go toward this special mission project. If you want to be a part of bringing *A Child's Garden of Bible Stories, Luther's Small Catechism* and *devotions* in the Haitian Creole and French languages (spoken throughout Haiti), just make your check out to Trinity and note in the memo place "Hearts for Jesus" or give cash specified to this mission project. You can introduce other children to Jesus for only \$5 per student.
