

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are beginning the month of May. May is one of those months that happen after Easter and before Summer.

Lots of things go on, most importantly graduations.

But besides graduations what is the most important thing to remember in May? It is Memorial Day.

Memorial Day began as Decoration Day to decorate the tombs of the Soldiers who died in the civil war. There are various traditions, but it was officially begun in 1868 by General John Logan who called for it to

be celebrated by all. After the world wars Americans continued to celebrate it more as Memorial Day than Decoration Day. It was declared officially Memorial Day in 1971 and moved to the last Monday of May.

Memorial Day along with Veterans Day (to commemorate the end of WWI) are the two days on which we remember and honor our military veterans.

During the month of May our lessons take a turn from what we have been hearing the past few months. Our Old Testament lessons now become readings from the book of Acts, our Epistle Lessons are now readings from the book of Revelation, and our Gospels all come from the Gospel of John.

The First lesson will tell us a lot about how things went in the Early Church, from Paul/Saul to Peter and others. We always hear from the book of Acts on Pentecost Sunday, but rarely hear from it, otherwise, so it is refreshing to hear from the book of Acts during the Easter Season.

The readings from the book of Revelation are also a nice change. The book of Revelation is one of the most misunderstood and mis-interpreted book of the Whole New Testament. It is not a book of Prophecy, but a book of Apocalypse.

We will hear many familiar parts of Revelation in our readings.

The clear message during the Easter season is that Christ Rose from the dead and won a victory for us all.

Peter and Paul remind us of this as they continue their ministry post resurrection. John reminds us in Revelation that the post resurrection Church looks toward heaven.

He is Risen, He is Risen indeed, Alleluia.



MARY GUILD


