

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I want to talk about a different topic this month and it is a little different. It is about the change in technology we have experienced in the past 30+ years.

Some of you are older than I and some of you are younger than I, but technology touches us all.

Last year in May, I started having problems with my cell phone. Many of you have heard some of this story, but this is the full version. We were on our way to Little Rock for one of my wife's Dr. appts. On the way up there, I wanted her to make a phone call or something (I always want my wife to handle my cell phone when driving. It forces me not to pay attention to it.) The problem was my phone would not work. I said we will look at it later. When I finally had a chance to look, all it did was give me a message that the phone could not connect to the network. When we were done, we went to the ATT store to try and track down what was going on. After two or three tries we finally found out what was going on. Sonmeone had filed an insurance claim on my phone and wanted the replacement delivered to New York City (one of the boroughs). They would ask if I knew anyone up there (My nephew) and stuff like that. Turns out it was a scam. Turns out it had happened a month earlier and was just now catching up with my phone line.

The Insurance company had blacklisted my phone. We pushed through, I used my secondary phone and finally said I was done. I went down to ATT got a new phone and a new number and ended it. I also wrote polite but strongly worded letters to each company complaining about how I had been treated.

I was still paying for the phone, that is what aggravated me the most. Then I got a phone call from ATT telling me I had dropped a phone that was needed to get the special pricing on the phone I just got. It took a month or two, but by the time we were done, the old phone was removed from my plan and paid off. The new phone got paid off. But one problem remained.

Have you ever noticed how our lives had become bound to our cell phone numbers? I mean literally everything we do is tied to our cell phone number.

My sisters Medicaid, they could not get in touch with me as they were calling the old number. Trying to get into some sites that require what is called Second Factor Authentication, requires access to the old number! It is absolutely crazy.

When we look at our lives, have we ever considered how much sin is tied into our lives? I don't mean just attached but interwoven. Just like that cell phone number, trying to get rid of sin in our lives is impossible. It is permanently attached to us.


So, what do we do? Trust in the means of Grace. There is a reason God gives us Baptism and the Lord's Supper. God gives to us those means to separate us from the sin that is so deeply woven into our lives. God says we are forgiven. It is like we get a new phone number with a new carrier that separates us from that old one. We are forgiven. Now understand we were already forgiven when Christ died on the cross, but those means of grace are our personal assurance it is ours.

I know the story of my phone is a long one, but so is the story of our sinfulness. The best part is God fixes all things in our spiritual lives. And we do not have to worry about anything hanging around. Yes, we will still be bothered by things, we will still commit sins. Yet unlike the phone company, with God there is grace. And it is ours.




A collection of cereal was donated by Mary Guild members. Approximately forty boxes were delivered that afternoon to the city cereal drive.


