

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we begin the New Year, I would like to discuss something.

As we get into the new year we will hear from Matthew 2.

Mat 2:12-15 And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way. (13) Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you, for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." (14) And he rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed to Egypt (15) and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, "Out of Egypt I called my son."

Joseph takes the baby Jesus and his mother to Egypt for safety. Very often this is called seeking sanctuary. That word is used a lot these days in political discourse, but I want to concentrate on the religious part of the word.

Sanctuary can also be used for the place where we worship. When I took my worship course in the seminary we went through the basic parts of the church. Of course, when we enter the church, we usually enter through what is called a Narthex. I had one church that did not have a Narthex you entered right into the Sanctuary.

The Narthex acts as a place where people can visit and conduct church business. We have signup sheets there and all sorts of other things (Portals of Prayers, Devotional books, informational brochures.) That leaves the Sanctuary as a place of worship.

We consider the Sanctuary a sacred space. We worship there and gather there as family. One of the uses of the sanctuary is also meditation before Worship. A number of our members use the Sanctuary before worship for this exact purpose.

One of the things we need to make sure of is to keep the noise in the sanctuary at a minimum during this time to afford them the tranquility they deserve. One of the ways to do this is to keep conversations that are loud out in the Narthex.

Now before someone jumps all over me. I know we are all getting older and we are all little hard of hearing. (Some of us more so, my hand is up!) One of the constant battles my wife and I have is being able to hear each other. One of the ways to help that issue, is to make sure you are looking at the person and talking to them so they can see you. I know it sounds strange, but it does help.

It is just a common courtesy for each other allowing folks who want some quiet time before worship to have that quiet time. We have plenty of spaces in our church for conversation. Let us be courteous to one another.

May you all have a blessed New Year and may God shower his blessings upon you.
